
Dialects In Motion

Dialects in Motion: The Artistry of J. Margulis

"Dialects in Motion" is a captivating journey into the immersive world of geometric abstraction and kinetic art by J. Margulis. The artworks presented in this exhibition showcase the discoveries made from the abounding yet meticulous explorations of the form and mark a milestone in the development of the artist's body of work.


By virtue of these explorations, J. Margulis has developed a distinctive approach in blending a divergence of visual elements into his work. He refers to these various combinations as "dialects" in order to emphasize the uniqueness and authenticity of each piece. The three "dialects" practiced in these artworks epitomize the current stage of the artist's ongoing evolution.

The first dialect on display challenges our perceptions, beckoning us to peer beyond the surface. Volumetric forms concealed beneath an illusory veneer lure the viewer into a realm where flatness gives way to multidimensionality. Only by gazing from various angles can one fully appreciate the design concealed within.

The second dialect presents an array of compositions where squares, elongated boxes, and other forms play at a multitude of elevations from the gallery walls. Here, the artist orchestrates the interplay of up to three layers of interactive colors, each nestled at varying depths against contrasting backgrounds. It's a visual symphony, where color and shape engage in a harmonious fugue.

The third dialect, in a daring leap, delves into the mesmerizing possibilities of using the geometry of written characters as the primary graphical elements of kinetic art expression. Through the repetition of cut-out acrylic objects, Margulis weaves words and phrases into his creations, inviting viewers to meditate on their deeper meanings. These linguistic forms interact with the medium's colors, creating a rich tapestry of visual and intellectual stimulation.

In exploring the intricate layers of these visuals, "Dialects in Motion" allows us to be transported into the vibrant dialogue between geometry, color, and the written word. Each piece is an invitation to ponder the beauty hidden within the seemingly ordinary and provides the viewer with an intimate experience of the rich and dynamic dimensions to the artistry of J. Margulis.








Frameworks, 2022





Composed, 2023


Gravity pulls, 2023 Size: 40 x 40 x 3" (100 x 100 x 8 cm)






















Enmeshed, 2023 Size: 48 x 48 x 3" (120 x 120 x 8 cm)





Straight diagonals, 2023Size: 71 x 26 x 3" (180 x 66 x 8 cm)











Within, 2022 Size: 48 x 48 x 3" (120 x 120 x 8 cm)



Through the veil, 2023 Size: 36 x 36 x 3" (91 x 91 x 8 cm)






